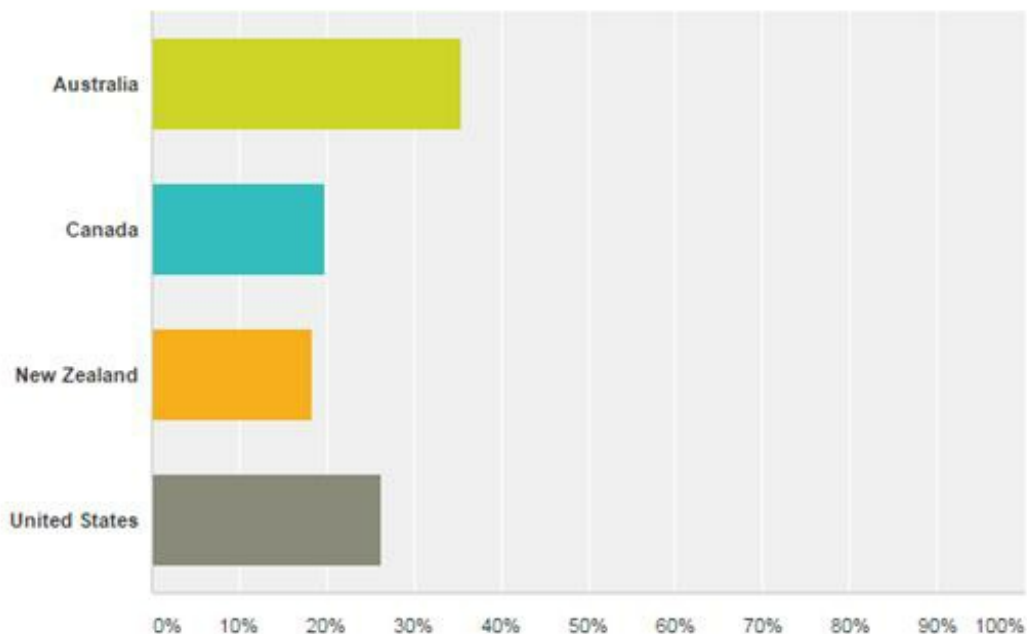

AGITG Annual Scientific Meeting

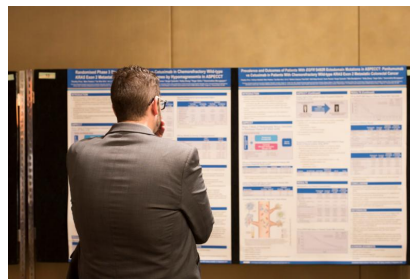
NETs will be a focus at the Annual Scientific Meeting.
